Framework description for projects under the umbrella project below

Project title	<p>Stop violence against women and girls</p> <p>The project will support development and advocacy initiatives aimed at stopping physical and psychological violence against women and girls. The project includes violence in a broad sense.</p> <p>Violence can be experienced in many ways, the hidden violence (ex. domestic violence), the social violence in the form of exclusion (ex. fistula women and witch girls), the cultural violence (ex. circumcision of girls and young women) and trafficking just to name a few examples.</p>
Background to the project	<p>Physical and psychological violence is found all over the world and it is typically women and girls who are exposed to it.</p> <p>Some 2019 figures on physical violence:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In Denmark is 33,000 women exposed to partner violence every year • One in 10 young women under the age of 24 has been subjected to violence from a current or former boyfriend • 1 in 3 women worldwide are subjected to physical or sexual violence during their lifetime • In Europe, at least 1 in 5 women are subjected to physical violence during their lifetime

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Between 500,000 and 2 million people are victims of trafficking every year. Women and girls account for about 80% of this. • In Europe, the majority of the many people who are victims of forced labour are women and girls trafficked into prostitution. • 1/3 of all women in developing countries get married before the age of 18, and every 7 seconds a girl under the age of 15 gets married. Half of all killings of women are committed by the partner, while only a few men are killed by their wife or girlfriend. • Today, more than 200 million girls and young women are circumcised worldwide and 2 million are still circumcised every year. <p>Psychological violence can be about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jealousy or possessiveness • Control and manipulation • Slander, denigration and exclusion of community • Threats and anxiety-creating tantrums <p>- i.e., behaviour which helps to deprive another person of her self-respect, whether at home, at work and in other contexts.</p> <p>Both physical and psychological violence should be combated, as violence is devastating for people. And women and girls are the two most vulnerable groups.</p>
<p>The purpose of the project</p>	<p>The project is an umbrella project to inspire and support the SI union, regions and clubs to initiate projects aimed at highlighting physical and psychological violence, including trafficking, in order to stop violent behaviour, as well as to support women and girls who have already been victims of violence in being able to recreate a good life.</p> <p>The project is open to other organisations – preferably in cooperation with clubs/regions/union – being granted funding from the project according to this project description.</p>
<p>Target group of the project</p>	<p>The target group of the project is women and girls who have been subjected to physical or psychological violence. The projects must either create a lasting absence of violence or focus public opinion on violence and the consequences of violence.</p>

	<p>Since, according to the statistics, it is most often men who practice violence against women, projects may therefore focus on men's behaviour, but with the aim of preventing them from engaging in violence against women and girls.</p>
<p>Application of funds from this umbrella project</p>	<p>Applications shall contain information on the same points as this project description and shall also include information on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the activities undertaken to achieve the objectives of the project. • who participates in the project and how (description of the project organisation), • timetable for each activity in the project; • how to anchor the project to those involved; • budget and financing; • how and when the project is evaluated; • how the project is communicated to society; • how new members are involved in the project;
<p>Schedule</p>	<p>The umbrella project runs for 4 years from 1 April 2021</p>
<p>Economy</p>	<p>The umbrella project supports projects approved by the FU on application. Regions, clubs and other actors can continuously donate funds to the project account</p>
<p>Internal communication</p>	<p>If support is provided from the umbrella project, the project organisation must submit evaluation and specified accounting to the FU within 3 months of the end of the project. A template for project application and evaluation form can be found on the Union website.</p>
